## *Generation No. 1*

1. ROBERT<sup>2</sup> TEMPLE (?<sup>1</sup>) was born About 1620, and died About 1685. He married HELEN MAIR.

Notes for ROBERT TEMPLE:

Robert Temple was an Elder of the Church of Ellon from 1650 - 1674

According to the Session Records for Ellon Church in 1685.

26th April. " The said day there was a silver cup presented by Robert Temple and Helen Mair his wife weighing twelve ounces and four drop the whole thing being worth for monie and workmanship 46 libs. and 8 shilling. "

"Record of Tenantry."

Nether Ardlethen (Milton). 510 Acres.

" In Gordon of Straloch's map of Aberdeenshire, 1659, the lands of Ardlethen are represented by two farms, namely, Nether and Over Ardlethen. In the 19th century, Nether Ardlethen became Milton of Ardlethen, and Over Ardlethen, Ardlethen. In 1512, a corn Mill was established at Nether Ardlethen.

Tenants.

1640- 1660. Robert Temple and Helen Mair, his wife. Robert Temple was of the family Temple, Cloisterseat, parish of Udney ; the family were tenants of Cloisterseat for over three centuries. Its most distinguished was the Rev. Dr. William Temple of Forgue, the author of the Thanage of Fermartyn, 1894. "

The following was written in " The Thanage of Fermartyn."

"Cloisterseat is a farm on Orchardtown not far from Monkshill. Both of these names point to a religious establishment that had at one period existed here, probably in connection with the original establishment of St. Drostan's Abbey, Deer; but there is no mention of this in the " Book of Deer."; there is no remains, no tradition, but simply "Umbra Nominus." the seat of the cloister. Here for many years was a family of the name of Temple. In the neighbourhood was Nedder Ardlethen, where, on 26th April, 1685, Robert Temple, and his wife Helen Mair, presented a silver cup for use in the holy communion to the church of Ellon,

weighing twelve ounces, sixteen drops.

(I) A son, probably or near relative, Robert Temple, Circa 1680, was in Cloisterseat. He and his wife, Jean Forbes, and son Robert, paid Poll Tax in 1696. This Robert Temple in 1700 witnessed a court act of Sir Alexander Eton of Pitmedden, whose tenant he was.

(II) Robert Temple, son of the preceeding, married Isobel Milne, witnesses in 1732, along with Alexander Mitchel, the deed of sasine of the lands of Orchardtown sold in that year.

(III) Robert Temple, son of the preceeding, married Margaret Simpson, was next tenant. The total acreage of the farm in

1770 was 364 Scotch acres, 17 poles.

(IV) Robert Temple married to Christian Allan, died 1861.

(V) Charles S. Temple, their son, died 16 June 1888, when the tenancy ended.

In the process of agriculture there was collected on this farm and adjoining lands of Drumbreck a considerable number of articles of the stone period and other curios. A large number of these were placed in 1862 in the National Museum, Edinburgh; but a considerable number still remains, now at St. Margaret's, Forgue."

" Cloisterseat is a farm on Orchardtown not far from Monkshill. Notes for GEORGE MILNE:

'The Estates of Esslemont' taken from 'A History of the Burgh and Parish of Ellon' by James Godman 1958. Mains of Esslemont is situated near the old castle of Esslemont built by the Cheynes. The farm is distinguished as the home of the family Milne for 236 years. John Milne in the Mill of Ardlethin in 1660, had a son GEORGE, who married ELIZABETH TEMPLE, born 1676 in Cloisterseat, the daughter of Robert Temple, Cloisterseat, Parish of Udney. George Milne was firstly tennant in Mains of Dumbreck, Udney. About 1720 he moved to the Main os Esslemont, eight years before the Gordons of Hallhead became proprietors of Esslemont. George Milne had a sister Isobel, 1676 - 1732, married to Robert Temple in Cloisterseat. Another sister, Agnes was married to Andrew Mair in Claymires. George Milne and Elizabeth Temle had four sons and three daughters.

George Milne was succeeded in Mains of Esslemont by his son George Milne, 1723 - 1794. He married firstly his first cousin Helen Mair, and secondly Margaret Walker Arbuthnot of Peterhead. Issue by Helen Mair: Andrew, William, Robert, George, in Mill of Fiddes and Haddo of Methlick; James who succeeded, and a daughter Margaret, married to James Imlach.

George Milne was "out" in the '45, and fought at Culloden.
